This week has been a very busy one, finishing off our theme "Toys and Play" and beginning our new theme "Create and Celebrate" by taking part in our annual Advent Day.



This week we have amazed Miss Pomfret with our knowledge and understanding of numbers 4 and 5! We have been practising our subitising (recognising how many without counting) and cardinality (knowing how many are in a set) skills as well as accurately counting by touching the object when we say the number.

Towards the end of the week, we have been outside exploring the chilly weather! We investigated what happens when we use water and paintbrushes to make marks in the frost! We also listened carefully to the crunchy sounds as we walked across the frosty field in our wellies.

This week your child will bring home a bookmark with Common Exception Words and High Frequency



words on. These are words that we encourage children to sight read rather than sounding out to support their fluency when reading. We would really appretiate you taking the time when reading at home to practise reading a couple of words at a time on the bookmark to help your child's fluency and word recognition.
