This week in maths we have been learning about number 4 and how it is made up of smaller numbers. We used the manipulatives to help us see this. We have also been on a shape hunt, looking for squares and rectangles.



We have finished reading our story Sam and Dave dig a hole and have been learning alternative words for tired, such as exhausted, fatigued, wiped out and drained.

In our phonic lessons we have been practising our rhyming skills, dropping parcels at the correct station. For example, we delivered the pan and man to the Fan Station and the bear, chair, and hair to the Pear Station. We have also been learning about alliteration and have come up with funny names for everyone in our class, ask your child if they can remember their own name.

Our Pamper afternoon was a resounding success. The children enjoyed using all their senses and it was a relaxing end to what has been a very busy half term.
