We have been busy again this week learning about our senses. On Tuesday, we learnt about our sense of smell by smelling a range of products including garlic, vinegar and more pleasant items such as soap and perfume. We learnt that some smells warn us of danger and others divide people's opinion as to whether they are pleasant or not pleasant.



In P.E we practised our underarm throwing techniques and learnt to put one foot forward and point towards the target.





This week we have used our sense of smell! We closed our eyes and smelt four different things- toothpaste, vinegar, ketchup and lavender soap. We watched how our friend's facial expressions changed as they smelt things that they like and dislike.



In maths we have been investigating mass using scales. We have enjoyed weighing and comparing items around the room as we tried to balance the scales.



This week we have thought carefully about our friendships by thinking about a what a good friendship needs. We talked about Bluey and Bingo, Simba and Nala, Buzz and Woody and Winnie and Piglet and how they play together, share, use kind words and help each other

out.



In PE we continued to work on our underarm throw- lots of us are using out 'tick tock' arms and standing with one leg in front of the other to throw accurately at a target!
