We have had fun in maths this week creating sets of objects that are identical. We talked about sets we have at home, such as a bucket and spade, a bat and ball and a set of clothes. The children can practise making sets by setting up a picnic for the bears in our maths area.



On Tuesday we investigated the toys we play with now and used the word PRESENT to describe the current period of time. We compared our toys and discovered a lot of them have batteries inside which mean they either make sounds, move, light up or even dance. The children were all competent at talking about their toys and how they worked.



In literacy we continued our work about the Rainbow fish and used the words Grandma Fantastic brought us to describe the different sea creatures in the story, including WONDEROUS, MAGNIFICENT and DAZZLING.
