

When the Romans left Britain in AD 410, they took their army with them, so the people had no one to protect them from attacks. Soon after, the Anglo-Saxons came from across the sea and began to settle, bringing their own kings, villages and way of life.



When the **Anglo-Saxons** came from Europe and settled in Britain, they built **villages** and kingdoms in places like Cheshire and Lancashire. Many place names, like Kirkby ("church village") and **Ormskirk** ("Ormr's church"), come from their language and show where they once lived and farmed.

Isobel Grant was a Scottish artist who created beautiful manuscripts, which are hand-written books decorated with colourful pictures and fancy letters. Her artwork helped bring stories to life and made books look special, even though there were no printers at the time!

**Beowulf** was a mythical brave warrior from Geatland who travelled to help the people of Denmark fight a terrible monster named Grendel. His story is important because it teaches us about courage, loyalty and heroism, and it's one of the oldest and most famous stories from Anglo-Saxon times.

Vocabulary						
Invasion	An <b>attack</b> or <b>assault</b> by one group of people on another's land often leading to settlement or control.					
Kingdom	A <b>country or area</b> ruled by a king or queen, or in Anglo-Saxon times, by a <b>ruler</b> or <b>chieftain</b> .					
Settlement	A place where people <b>establish a community</b> or build <b>homes</b> to live in.					
Monastery	A building or complex where <b>monks</b> live, work and worship, often a centre for learning and <b>Christianity</b> .					
Raids	<b>Surprise attacks or invasions</b> , often for the purpose of stealing goods, as the Anglo-Saxons sometimes did or defended against.					
Saxon	A member of a group of people from <b>northern Eur</b> ope who settled in <b>Britain</b> after the <b>Romans</b> left.					
Tribe	A group of people with a <b>common ancestry, culture or language</b> , often living together in a specific area.					
Chronicle	A detailed account or record of <b>historical events</b> , often written down for future generations.
